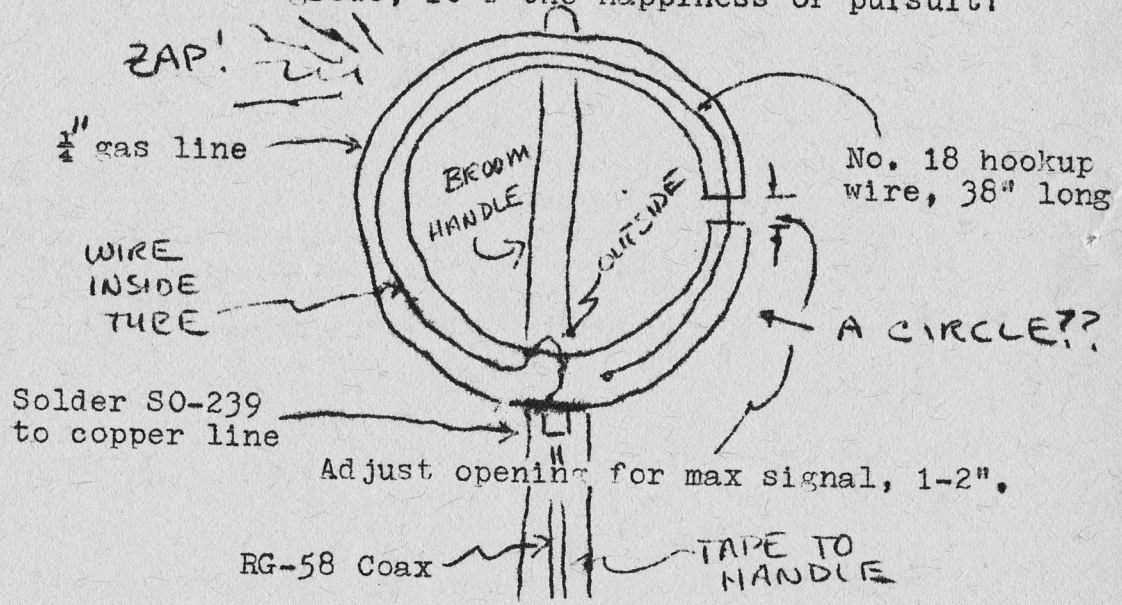

TWO-METER XMTR FINDING LOOP

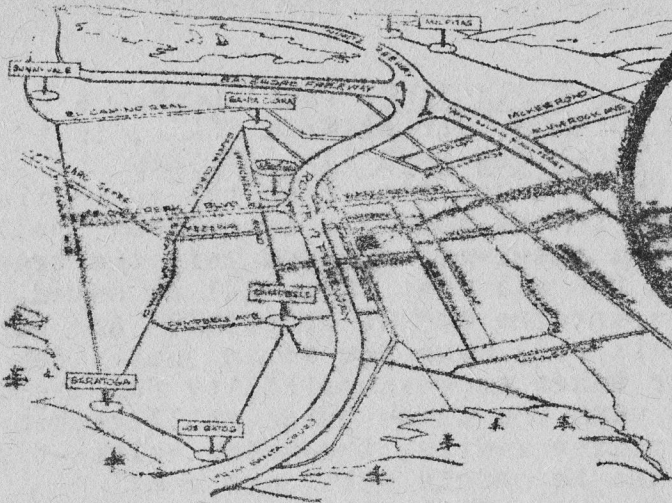
Whatsamatter, OM, did you lose your two meter transmitter?

closed side towards signal.

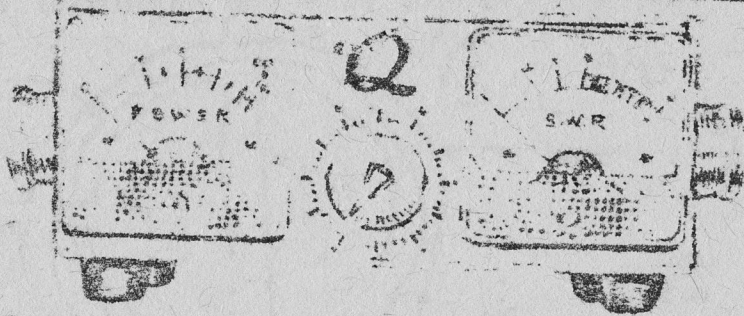
