

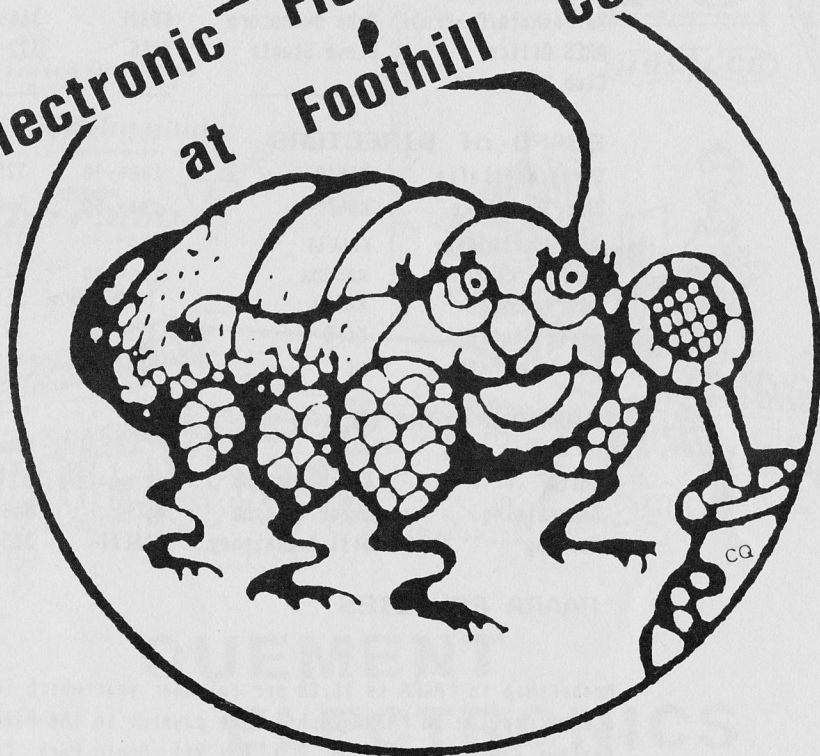

# Gerald Starkey, engineer

Services were Tuesday in Palo Alto for Gerald Edsel Starkey, 63, who retired as a Santa Clara County environmental engineer in 1984.

Mr. Starkey, who served 14 years as a noise consultant to the county health department, died at his Los Altos home Thursday of complications

segment, from 1968 until his retirement in 1970, was at Onizuka Air Force Base, the Air Force's satellite test center in Sunnyvale. He received a master's degree in civil engineering in the early 1970s from San Jose State University.

Mr. Starkey developed an interest in ham radio during the 1950s and was the president of the Foothill Amateur Radio Society. He held an extra class amateur radio license, WA6LJJ.

He was also a member of the Palo Alto Amateur Radio Association, Southern Peninsula Emergency Communications Systems Users

from diabetes.

Mr. Starkey held degrees in mechanical, civil and metallurgical engineering.

Mr. Starkey was born in Elyria, Ohio, and attended school in Cleveland. After a semester of engineering studies at Case Western Reserve University, he joined the U.S. Navy.

During World War II, he served as a machinist's mate aboard a large amphibious landing craft at Leyte Gulf that hauled troops and cargo for the invasion of the Philippines.

He returned to college after the war, at Ohio State University in Columbus, enrolling at the same time in the Air Force Reserve Officers Training Corps. Upon completion of his engineering studies at Ohio State in 1951, he was commissioned a second lieutenant in the U.S. Air Force. He was a member of Tau Beta Pi at Ohio State.
